- 3. After judging the Fair will display a portion of the product and the remaining portion will be auctioned on Tuesday at 7:30 p.m. at the stage. The Denver Fair Committee does not require or provide a list of ingredients in the baked goods to be sold, therefore, the Committee accepts no responsibility on the behalf of the buyers.
- 4. Articles having no competition will not receive a Premium unless worthy.
- 5. Items will be judged on appearance, flavor, consistency and texture; and class description.
- 6. No items requiring refrigeration will be accepted.
- 7. All pans, plates, dishes are considered disposable and will not be returned.
- 8. It is recommended to submit items on stiff plates and enclosed in a large, sealed plastic bag to retain freshness until judging.
- Entrants may be disqualified if item is categorized incorrectly, item is inedible or class requirement is not met (ie: quantity or size).

YOUTH VEGETABLES, FRUITS, NUTS

DEPARTMENT 11 (Under 19 Years of Age) Chairperson: Joanne Brubaker - (717) 466-4869

- 1. In selecting vegetables for exhibition, choose such specimens that would bring the highest market price. Do not select the largest, unless class requests it, select medium size specimens. Do not mix varieties.
- 2. These factors are generally used by the vegetable judges:
 - a. Trueness to variety, type. Pick the specimens from one variety.
 - b. Uniformity in size, shape and color.
 - c. Pick out a perfect specimen, then select others as similar to it as possible. Never mix specimens or varying maturities.
 - d. Protect from dirt, disease, infection and mechanical damage. Select specimens show no blemishes of any kind.
 - e. Condition and maturity. Be sure exhibits are of high quality.
 - f. Potatoes should not be washed. Remove soil using a soft cloth or soft brush.
 - g. Tomatoes should have stems removed.
 - h. Carrots, beets, etc. should have tops (leaves) removed leaving about 2" of stems.
- 3. Read premium material carefully and follow all rules and regulations. If an entry calls for five specimens, exhibit that number, do not enter more or less. Your exhibit will be disqualified for having the wrong number of specimens other than that stipulated.
- 4. All Denver Fair rules apply (see front of book). The judges have the final decision in all exhibits. If a judge decides an entry is not worthy of a ribbon, no ribbon will be awarded.
- 5. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to correctly identify the vegetable, fruit or nut entry. Entering them in the wrong class will disqualify them from judging. We will not move or reclassify entries.

6. NO REGISTERING FOR OTHER PEOPLE.

7. All vegetables must be grown by amateurs. No commercial growers. A commercial grower is one that grows on three or more acres and sells produce to supplement family income.
